A Year In The Life of a PCP

Two people per precinct are elected at Caucus March 6, 2012. There are 344 precincts.	You become a member of the Denver Democratic Central Committee
Attend PCP Orientation Training	Ask your Captain to schedule
Attend County Assembly / Convention - <i>if elected as a delegate at Caucus, or come help as a volunteer</i>	March 31, 2012 at Evie Garrett Dennis Campus / Green Valley Ranch <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Become a delegate to the District and County Assembly or Convention?
Attend State Assembly / Convention - <i>if elected as a delegate at County Assembly or Convention, or come help as a volunteer</i>	April 14, 2012 in at the Pueblo County Fairgrounds, Pueblo, Colorado <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Become a delegate to the National Convention in Charlotte, North Carolina? <i>(That's a whole different chart)</i>
Begin Precinct Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Arrange to obtain a VAN login, VAN training or VAN list (Voter Action Network)• Obtain PCP Handbook, 'Think Precinct' book and PCP training• Begin planning how to canvass your precinct• Examine voter data for the precinct to identify who to see and what to say• Prepare lists of active Democrats and Unaffiliated voters• Develop a 'talk from' piece [use the 3-39 Rule]• Make calls to recruit a Precinct Team to help canvass your precinct• Present your precinct plan to the team, including recording results and updating VAN records
Attend monthly District or Sub-District Meetings	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maintain contact with Sub-District leaders and other PCPs• Stay informed of fundraisers, outreach activities and community action days.• Help recruit volunteers, additional PCPs or Century Club Members (donors of \$100 or more per year)

Regularly visit www.denverdemocrats.org	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Keep up with events and information about the Democratic Party of Denver, Issues, Candidates, Fundraisers, Important Dates, etc.• Get involved in a county-wide committee such as GOTV, Public Policy
Implement the Denver GOTV Plan for the local Primary Elections	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Phone banking to apartments (which cannot be accessed by 'walk and knock events' and other contact with active voters• Plan and execute a second canvass with your precinct team
Primary Election, June 26, 2012	Additional Precinct activities until the Primary Election
Work the Denver GOTV Plan through the General Election Nov. 6, 2012	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Primary Election selected Candidates the party will support• Work with Party Candidates and the GOTV Plan• Continue precinct canvasses and hand out literature with candidates
After The Election	Regroup, reflect and record experiences, (<i>debrief yourself and your team, so you all learn from the experience</i>)
Attend Central Committee Meetings	The DPoD Central Committee usually meets one or two times each year to approve rules, budget, delegate selection plan, etc. As a member, you are required to attend
Attend Biennial Organization Meeting, February 2013	Central Committee meets to elect new County Officers; Districts elect District Officers (<i>Multi-County Districts may meet separately and have slightly different rules</i>); and Sub-districts meet to elect Captains and Co-Captains
Winter to Spring	Prepare for Caucus in Spring 2014 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call active Democrats in your precinct to assure they attend caucus and to become delegates to the coming County Assembly
Attend Caucus 2014	Determine if you will seek to be re-elected as Precinct Committee Person for 2 more years!
